### **HOMEWORK FOR LEARNING**

- 1. Sew side seams**
- 2. Sewing a set-in sleeve**
- 3. Weaving in the ends as you knit.**

Supplies to bring: Tapestry needle, scissors, extra yarn & pins.

#### Swatches for sewing in sleeves

Swatch #1

Cast on 20 sts.

Work in st st for 2", ending after a purl row.,

Row 1: Bind of 4 sts, work to end. (16 sts)

Row 2: Purl.

Row 3: K1, k2tog, k to end.

Row 4: Purl.

Repeat Rows 3 & 4, three more times. (12 sts)

Work in st st for 3" Bind off loosely.

Swatch #2

Cast on 40 sts.

Work in st st for 2", ending after a wrong side row.

Bind off 4 sts at the beginning of the next two rows. (32 sts)

Row 1: K1, k2tog, k to the last 3 sts, SSK k1.

Row 2: Purl.

Repeat Rows 1 & 2, three more times. (24 sts)

Work in st st for 2 1/2" bind off loosely.

Swatches for weaving in the ends as you knit

Swatch #3

Cast on 20 sts.

Work in st st for 3". Cut yarn. Leave sts on needles. Bring a second color yarn of yarn about the same weight.

Bring Swatch #1
