Cast on 20 sts and work in k1, p1 rib for 6 rows.

1. Cut yarn about 20".

Leave work on needles.

Bring a tapestry needle.



## *Someone's In The Kitchen With . . .*

This month's recipe is from:

### Pumpkin Cake

Combine and press into 9 X 13 pan:

1 box moist yellow cake mix (save out 1 cup for topping)

½ cup melted butter

1 egg

Combine and pour on top of cake mixture:

1 large can pumpkin pie filling

3 eggs

2 tsp. cinnamon

½ cup brown sugar

Topping:

1 cup reserved cake mix

½ cup sugar

1/4 cup soft margarine

2/3 cup chopped nuts

½ cup coconut (shredded or flaked)

Bake at 350 for 50-60 minutes. Let stand until cool.

Refrigerate covered. Best served cold. I like to double this recipe and add additional nuts and coconut. Also, you'll need a larger pan for toppings. The larger version cooks a little longer 60-65 minutes.

If you don't have access to ready made button tubes, you can make your own by buying clear plastic tubing at a garden supply store or garden department of a home improvement store. You can then use these to store double pointed needles or loose buttons.
