YARN CRAWL SUGGESTIONS

We discussed two potential yarn crawl routes for this spring and/or summer.

One might be an East Bay yarn crawl to *Claddagh Yarns* at 1506 Walnut Street in Berkeley, *Piedmont Yarns and Apparel* at 4171 Piedmont Avenue, Suite 102, Oakland, CA, *BiStitchual Yarn and Notions* at 2406 Pinole Avenue in Pinole, *K2TOG* at 1325 Solano Ave (between Pomona Ave & Ramona Ave) in Albany, CA 94706 and *Verb to Keep Warm* in Berkeley. The idea would be to carpool from Marin at 10 AM, visit two stores in the morning, have lunch together, and visit two more stores.

Another yarn crawl might be to go to the Valley Ford Mercantile and Wool Mill in Sonoma County which processes wool and sells wool products. The owner is open to a road trip and there is a gift shop. She is active in Fibershed.com. Fibershed's web site states that: "The mission of Fibershed is to change the way we clothe ourselves by supporting the creation of local textile cultures that enhance ecological balance, and utilize regional agriculture while strengthening local economies and communities." There is also a farm nearby in Two Rock that we could visit.

MEDIA AND OTHER REPORTS

The **Marin Art & Garden Center** in Ross has a crafts room that it may open to the public for rental. If the Guild is interested, we could display information about us, as well as provide a place for our members to sell hand made items for a brief period of time. There would be a rental fee of \$100 for three and half weeks. MAGC would take 30% of the retail price for items sold. Currently, the room is available Feb 9-Mar 1, May 18-June 7 and June 15-July 12. We would want to have time to advertise this adventure well in advance of taking this on, if we do. We will discuss this proposal at future meetings, including if we are required to charge sales taxes, staffing, etc.

Muench Yarns at 1323 Scott Street in Petaluma (800) 733-9276 is a wholesaler of yarns, needles, buttons, patterns, etc. Muench has opened a retail showroom where the public may purchase discontinued yarns and other items. Store hours are 9-3, Tuesday to Friday.

WORKSHOP

Diane Sack provided detailed instructions for learning the Broomstick Stitch using two very-different size knitting needles – in this example, sizes 8 and 17. Diane mentioned that the name of the stitch comes from historically using a broomstick handle for the larger needle.

After we laughed and had fun with the two needle sizes, Nazee Fard gave us instructions for accomplishing the same stitch using a crochet hook.

Diane and Nazee provided written instructions to all of us. We learned a really interesting stitch that is less complicated to do than it looks!

The guild was established in 1987 to promote interest in the craft and workmanship of knitting.
