MARIN COUNTY FAIR REPORT

Elaine Johnson had a conversation with the Marin County Fair people. Because of the decrease of members in the Marin Knitters Guild, we have lowered the amounts of the prizes given at the fair. We will donate \$75.00 to adult division Best in Show and \$25.00 to the junior division Best in Show.

The opening day of the fair is Wednesday, July 2 and we need members to staff the knitting table in three hour shifts.

CRAFTS ROOM

Elaine Johnson reported on the proposed place where members can put their knitting and crocheting for sale. It is at the Marin Art & Garden Center in Ross which has a crafts room that can be rented. We will need quite a few members to show up with a lot of items to make it pay (rent is \$100 for 3 weeks). Elaine will follow up with additional information via our Yahoo! Website and at future Guild meetings.

SPRING YARN CRAWL

We decided that our Spring Yarn Crawl will be to the East Bay on Saturday, May 3. We will visit three yarn shops and enjoy lunch together. MEDIA AND OTHER REPORTS

Elaine Johnson gave our Guild information to Debbie McFarland, a knitting instructor, to pass along to her students at the Community Education program.

WORKSHOP – LACE KNITTING & CROCHET

Nazee Fard, Kathryn Baston and Christine Bonninn talked about and gave hints on knitting and crocheting lace.

Nazee said that lace can be divided into three categories: (1) Eyelet (yarn-over next to a decrease), (2) Lace Knitting (yarn-overs, decreases, etc. on one side; knitting and a rest row usually purling on the opposite side, and (3) Knitted Lace (has yarn-overs, decreases, etc., on both sides). She said to use a larger needle with a pointy tip than the yarn usually calls for so that you can see the pattern.

Kathryn said to use plenty of markers. Lifelines can be made with the very cheapest dental floss or 1/8" ribbon. Her hint on the yarn-overs is to put the yarn where you want it to end up.

Christine discussed crocheted lace scarves and a poncho.



SHOW & TELL

Jane Cooperman had a new cable jacket and different scarves. Christine had an example of "arm knitting" and a Steven West pattern scarf. Our guest, Jan Anderson from Corvallis, Oregon was making an entrelac with cables baby blanket. Both Jan and Sue Jenkins raved about the Madrona Fiber Arts Winter Retreat which is held this year from February 13-16 in Tacoma, Washington.

The guild was established in 1987 to promote interest in the craft and workmanship of knitting. While our name states Marin Knitters' Guild, today our membership hails from the counties of San Francisco, San Mateo, Solano and Sonoma as well as Marin.

Knitters with all levels of experience are welcome to participate. We encourage beginners to join and learn from the experienced. The Guild draws on talent and expertise of its membership and the knitting and fiber-arts community at large for programs and workshops.
