SHOW & TELL

Dana: finishing a requested sweater for her son. She finished several gifts and a candy cane cozy

Carita: wore a kit sweater from Stitches West. She is knitting pink pussy hats

Sue: a garter hat to gift. She finished her first commissioned piece, a scarf. This triggered a discussed about commission pricing. Common practice is to charge by the yard of yarn knit, e.g. \$0.30/yard for plain knitting up to 0.58/yd for complicated knitting, in addition to the cost of the yarn. Elain has a sliding scale she will send Sue

Aliyya: matching sweater and socks for her granddaughter and Quidditch- inspired sweater for her grandson

Marilyn: socks to match her shirt.

Jennifer: ZickZack scarf using Mini Mochi. Others have used Knit Picks Chroma

Lois: Boghead hat. She is knit several birds from The Field Guide to Knitted Birds by Arne and Carl

Ruth: child's Guernsey and matching hat out of donated yarn. She combined two kinds of donated yarn to knit a bi-colored sweater. She doubled the yard for seed-stitch edges

Elaine: knitting gift hats for her doctor's office. She knit a commissioned sweater out of tweedy yarn and seamed it with needlepoint yarn. She wore an Ann Norling vest.

Gail: hats for St. Anthony's and 2 shawls for the Larkspur library display.

Kathie: a garter shawl with 2 yarns and a lace shawl. **Nazee:** committed to 4 items due in January. She wore a beautiful sweater from donated yarn.

Jane: a cabled sweater with dog buttons and a shawl for St. Anthony's.

Joan: a knitted alligator scarf.

Tamara: Best Friends scarf pattern for a long-time friend.

Diane: hand warmers with a glove liner with redtipped fingers.

Martha: cowl out of leftover Sweet Georgia yarn. She wore a stole out of gifted multicolored yarn and matching stash yarn.

Arlene: a short row scarf.



PREVIEW OF JANUARY PROGRAM

KNITTING WITH BEADS

Items needed:

- 1. Lace weight or fingering weight yarn
- 2. Knitting needles size 3 for lace weight and size 4 for fingering weight yarn
- 3. Size E (6/0) beads available at Jo Ann's or Michael's
- 4. Steel crochet hook size 10 or any size that passes through the hole in the beads
- 5. Patience

Homework:

Cast on 21 sts. Work 4 ridges (8 rows) of garter stitch
